LOCATION: Cliff Illig's Farm, SE of LaCygne, Kansas. GPS coordinates: 38 13' 35"N 94 36"10"W

ACTIVITIES & SCHEDULE:

Mustang Patrol Scouts: (Arrive Saturday morning & depart Sunday morning)

- If you took a Troop tent home, you must bring it to this campout or arrange for another scout to bring it.
- Meet at Prairie Star Middle School at 7:30am, Saturday April 17th
- **Depart from the school at 8:00am SHARP !!!**
- Arrive at Illig's Farm; Set-up Camp
- Work on Scout Skills & early Rank Advancement.
- Work on Cooking Skills (see below)
- Fishing – bring gear & bait
- Attend & Witness Order of the Arrow Ceremony
- Crackerbarrel Saturday night

All Other Troop 10 Scouts: (Arrive Friday evening, Saturday & Depart Sunday AM)

- Leave for Illig's Farm as early as possible Friday, April 16th
- Arrive at Illig's Farm; Set up Camp
- **ALL OA Members**, Practice Ceremony & Construct Campfires
- **ALL OA Members**; Perform Tapout Ceremony
- Non OA Members; Help Mustang Scouts & Attend OA Tapout Ceremony
- Fishing (as time allows) – bring gear & bait
- Crackerbarrel Saturday Evening

Other Activities:

- Fishing in Mr. Illig's well stocked Lakes (Bring fishing gear & bait)
- May work on Fishing Merit Badge
- Orienteering Course For Mustang Rank Advancement. Bring a compass if you have one
- Conservation Project (details to follow)

FOOD/COOKING FORMAT:

Friday Supper: Eat before you arrive.

Saturday Breakfast:

Patrols plan and prepare a **Hot Breakfast**
Mustang Scouts & Parents eat before you meet at PSMS
Adults & SPL Staff will cook & eat as the "Old Goat" Patrol.

Saturday Lunch – Everyone bring a **Sack Lunch**.

Saturday Supper:

Patrols plan and prepare a **Hot Supper**
Mustang Scouts will prepare a **Hot Supper** – the food will be provided
Adults & SPL Staff will cook & eat as the "Old Goat" Patrol.

Sunday Breakfast:

Patrols plan and prepare a **Hot Breakfast**
Mustang Scouts will prepare a **Hot Breakfast** – the food will be provided
Adults & SPL Staff will cook & eat as the "Old Goat" Patrol.

Troop Policy: NO Lighter Fluid, "Match-light", or accelerant to be used.
Charcoal chimneys are provided by the Troop

EQUIPMENT NEEDED:

Mustang Patrol Scouts: (consult your Scout Handbook for a complete list)

- Cold/Cool weather clothing, extra dry clothing to change into at night
- (socks, sweats, t-shirts, stocking hat, gloves, etc.)
- Sturdy Boots or shoes & extra pair shoes.
- Sleeping Bag – cold weather, Ground Mat
- Mess Kit (bowl, plate, insulated cup, knife, fork, spoon)
- Rain Gear
- Canteen or water bottle
- Compass
- Fishing Gear & Bait
- Tents & ground cloth (if you took one home last month)
- **SCOUT HANDBOOK and PEN (mark book with your name)**
- **Field Uniform (Class “A”) Shirt for Saturday Night Ceremony**

All Other Troop 10 Scouts:

- Same equipment as above
- Patrol tents & tarps (check to make sure **ALL** parts are present)
- Patrol Cook Boxes (cleaned & stocked)
- Food for all meals
- **OA Members need to bring tribal attire if you have it.**
- **OA Members – Remember to bring your OA Sash.**
- **Field Uniform (Class “A”) Shirt for Saturday Night Ceremony (if not in tribal attire).**

Patrols need to work together to make sure that patrol tents and cooking boxes are brought to camp by assigned patrol members. **If you have Patrol Equipment (tents, tarps, stoves, cooking equipment), make sure it makes it to this campout even if you aren't attending.** Call your patrol leader, if he doesn't call you by Wednesday, April 14th. Patrol Quartermasters must speak to the Troop Quartermaster, Chuck Gibson, quartermaster@bsatrop10.org (913) 681-8881; if ANY additional equipment is needed (i.e. cooking grates, bricks, tent poles, tent pegs, tarps, tents).

***NOTE TO NEW SCOUTS (MUSTANG PATROL)**

The Troop has a large stock of equipment we use on our campouts and other outings. We provide: tents, ground cloths (tarps), cooking equipment, water coolers, propane lanterns, tables, toilet paper, cleaning supplies, first aid supplies & shelters. All adults must bring their own equipment (tent, ground cover, plates, spoons, etc.)

Troop 10 Chair Policy: We honor our Eagle Scouts and adults by allowing them to use chairs with backs. All non-eagle scouts can must use tripod-type camp stools.

On this Campout, our new Scouts (Mustang Patrol) will be cooking their own Supper & Breakfast. Troop 10 will purchase the necessary food and provide the needed cooking equipment. Plenty of older Scout & Adult supervision will be provided.

COST: **\$22.00** Mustang Patrol Scouts and All Adults
 \$10.00 All other Troop 10 Scouts (plus patrol food costs)

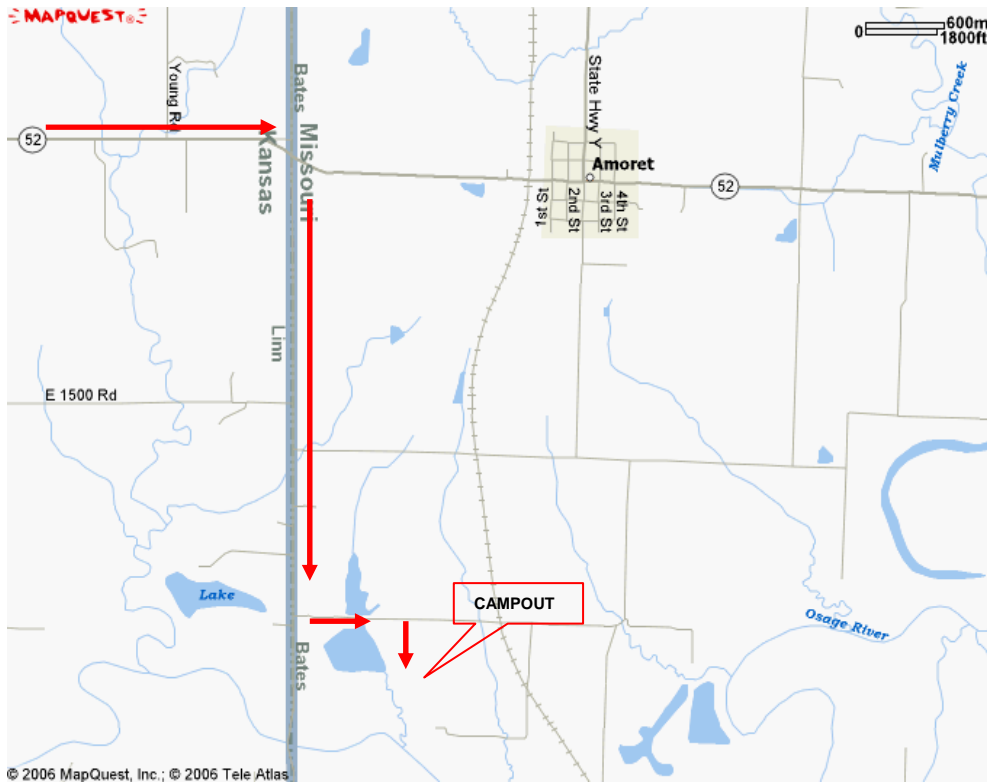
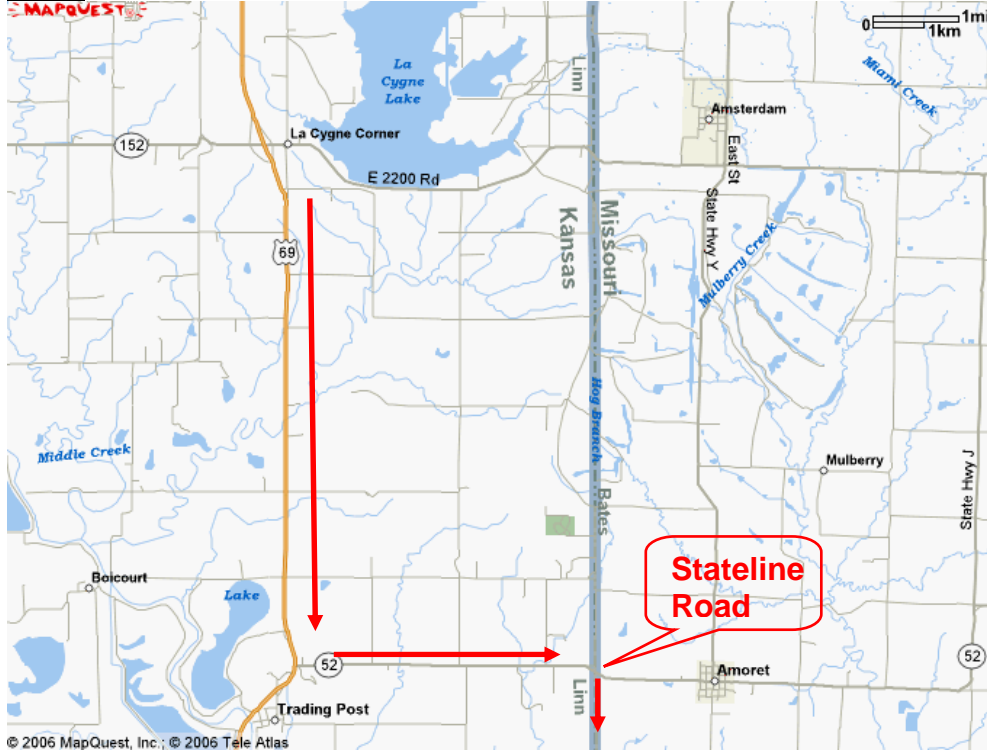
REGISTRATION: Please sign-up by the April 12th Troop Meeting or via e-mail to:
campmaster@bsatrop10.org. **Your fee will be added to your account by John Martin, Troop Treasurer. No shows and cancellations after April 15th will be charged the full amount.**

If you plan to arrive late, leave early or leave during the campout, you **MUST** contact our Scoutmaster, Greg Spies, scoutmaster@bsatrop10.org, **before 8:00am Friday April 16th** or you may not get credit for the campout.

COORDINATING PATROL: The coordinating patrol will be the **ANTELOPE** Patrol. The **ANTELOPE** Patrol Scouts and **ALL** quartermasters are responsible to load the truck on Thursday, April 15th at 6:00pm and unload the troop truck on Sunday morning. **ANTELOPE** Patrol must arrange for someone to drive the truck to the campout.

DIRECTIONS: From PSMS take Mission Road north to 135th Street. 135th Street west to 69 Hwy. South. Drive south on US 69 about 42 miles to State Highway 52; (52 is about 5 miles south of 152 which is the exit for LaCygne) Turn left on Hwy. 52 and drive east towards Butler about 3.4 miles; just after the “Leaving Kansas” sign turn right onto gravel road (Stateline Road) and drive south about 2.1 miles; turn left onto gravel road (if you get to the Marias de Cygne river, you went too far); drive about 0.3 miles east and look for gate on the right (south) side of the road, just past the Illig’s lakes; turn right into gate - you are there!
