



A major part of your Eagle effort is for you to develop into a Leader.

Between the ranks of Star and Life, Scouting has an expectations change. Below the rank of Star, it is our desire that each Scout learn to be part of a team and to learn the essential skills that will help them throughout their Scouting career and beyond. But as a Scout approaches Life and certainly Eagle, the goal is for the Scout to move from *passive* participation and instructor to become an *active* leader.

An Eagle Scout cannot be a *passive* participant - waiting to be involved - you must be willing to participate, to look for opportunities to instruct and help others.

An Eagle Scout is an *active* leader. They see what needs to be done and gets involved. They work with our younger Scouts and asks how they can help them. They no longer expect their parents to contact the leaders in the troop. They are responsible.

Being an Eagle Scout is more than just 21 merit badges and a Eagle project. An Eagle Scout is a leader, a self starter and someone others go to for help. It is a lifelong achievement that makes a person stand out from the rest. The rank of Eagle is special.
